

It features showy red flowers along the branches in early spring before the leaves, gray bark, and brick red branches that add an interesting dimension to the landscape. This is a low maintenance tree with a high canopy great for creating a shady retreat.

Black Hills Spruce





The Black Hills spruce is a good yard or ornamental tree. This evergreen has a conical form, compact, dense, ascending branches, and deep green colored needles. It is a tough tree for difficult sites. It is adapted to cold and is very resistant to winter injury.

The Black Hills spruce can be used as a windbreak and shelterbelt, privacy screen, accent planting, group plantings in recreation areas and public grounds, Christmas tree. It requires little pruning. It has a shallow, fiberous, wide spreading root system and thin, flaky-scaled ashygray/brown bark. The needles are individually attached, and foliage color varies from deep green to blue green. The brown cylindrical cones appear in late July and may persist on the tree into January.

Canadian Hemlock - Spruce







The Canadian Hemlock tree is also called Eastern Hemlock. It may take 250 to 300 years to reach maturity and may live for 800 years or more. It has a graceful pyramidal form with foliage of spray-like appearance. A very hardy specimen, easily transplanted conifer, grows well in a variety of soils. Often used to shelter small plants from drying winds. They stand shearing and pruning well and are excellent as hedges. They are graceful and make great ornamental plantings.

Dwarf Mountain Mugo Pine







The Mugho Pine tree has branching, upright stems evenly covered in 2-inch-long needles of a deep, dark true green. Thanks to its low growth, mugho pine can be used at the front of a border or anywhere you want yearround greenery in conifer form. Roots grow near the surface, so using a cover soil with a 2-inch-thick mulch to protect them is recommended. These trees are easily transplanted. They make a great landscaping evergreen tree because their shape and size are controllable by shearing.

Green Velvet Boxwood



The Boxwood 'Green Velvet, also known as Boxwood, is a slow growing broadleaf evergreen that requires little care. It is traditionally planted in shady sites. However, it is very tolerant of sunny locations as long as it receives sufficient moisture. It is a handsome, rounded, full-bodied, slow-growing shrub with small dark green leaves. Boxwoods are tolerant of pruning and shearing, but avoid cultivating around this plant because they have very shallow roots. Remove dead and damaged branches annually to improve the air circulation. Can be used individually or in clusters and is commonly used as a hedge or foundation planting.

The Japanese Red Maple tree is one of the most popular ornamental plants. This plant can be a single-stemmed small tree or multi-stemmed shrub and is often used as a single specimen or in borders or groupings. The leaves are reddishpurple in spring and again in fall.

The Japanese Red Maple features palm-shaped foliage that will stay a rich burgundy-purple all season long and turn an outstanding red in the fall. The rough gray bark and red branches add an interesting dimension to the landscape. It requires a lot of room to grow, but will be well worth it. This is a relatively low maintenance tree and should only be pruned in summer after the leaves have fully developed.

Prairifire™ Crimson Crabapple Tree









This upright rounded crabapple tree is very disease resistant, Unlike the old-time crabapples, this tree requires no chemical spraying to keep its maroon to dark green leaves healthy. The red flower buds open to a dark pinkish red in a gorgeous spring display. Fall foliage is various shades of yellow, orange and red. Even in the grayest months of winter, this remarkable tree is a feast for the eyes with dark red bark that resembles cherry. The show continues with the pea size, dark red fruit hanging on into winter. Prairifire will grow about 1 ft. per year to a height and spread of 20 ft. by 20 ft. Grows in most soil conditions except very wet.

Red Jewel Flowering Crabapple Tree 😓







This disease resistant, semi-weeping, decidouss crabapple tree will add a lush point of interest to any landscape. Its large deep green leaves and strikingly large berries will add a subtle touch of vibrance in mid-spring. Late in the Spring, white flowers will bloom livening up the landscape even more while the red berries hang late into the season. Red Jewels do well in most soil and benefit from fertilizers high in nitrogen when applied EARLY in the growing season. They also tend to flower more heavily and have more vibrant leaves when in full sunlight.

Serbian Spruce





This narrowly pyramidal evergreen is more slender and graceful than other spruces. It does not have the same wide spread as most, but is sure to grow quite tall. It has cylindrical curved, brown reddish cones with small stiff tightened scales. This spruce should not typically be used as a windbreak as the needles are prone to winterburn in areas with strong winds.

Swiss Stone Pine Tree





Landscapes that need a stately evergreen tree need to look to the little known Swiss Stone Pine. It has graceful dark green needles in bundles of five that are soft to the touch and it retains its rich deep color throughout the winter. It is low maintenance and usually looks its best without pruning, although it will tolerate some pruning.

The needles are very resistant to winter burn from sun and wind. And unlike most other pines which have a tendency to shed their lower branches as they mature, this pine remains thick and dense right down to the ground through most of its life. It is, in a word, beautiful. On the flip side, it is very slow growing, so it will take many years to reach tree height, and doesn't transplant well when larger. However it can live up to 120 years!

Whitespire Birch





The Whitespire Birch is preferred for it's dark green foliage in Spring and Summer, it's wonderful snowy white bark, and attractive fall color. The smooth white bark is extremely showy and adds significant winter interest.

It is a deciduous tree with a distinctive and refined pyramidal form. It tends to have a low canopy with a typical clearance of 4 feet from the ground, and should not be planted underneath power lines.
